THE FLIPPED CLASSROOM



We are delighted to announce that Murray Jensen from the University of Minnesota will be giving his presentation on Process Oriented Guided Inquiry Learning (POGIL). A teaching and learning method that can help guide the creation of student activities for the flipped classroom. Murray gave this keynote presentation at the IUPS Education workshop in Bristol in July this year and has some wonderful examples of POGIL activities in physiology.

The POGIL presentation will lay the groundwork for the following session on the “Flipped Classroom” in which invited speakers will illustrate how they have been using the “Flipped Classroom” in their own teaching and will provide a forum for a dialogue about how the “flipped Classroom” can be used in physiology education. Time will be allocated in the workshop for participants to engage in trialling videos of their own and constructing worksheets (including POGIL) as a first step towards adopting this pedagogy.
