

## **AuPS Physiology Education Grant Scheme**

The AuPS Physiology Education Grant scheme is to support an education-based research project that should be achievable in the year after receipt of the grant. The recipient(s) will be mentored by a senior physiology education researcher/recipient of the Michael Roberts Prize

The application will be assessed on how the research will benefit physiology education or enhance student engagement with Physiology.

One \$3,000 AUD grant is available, awarded to the best application from members of the AuPS.

## **Application & Eligibility:**

This Scheme is open early to mid-career academics (individuals or teams) who have been in academic positions for up to 10 years and who are all current ordinary financial members of the Australian Physiological Society (note: provisional members are not eligible to apply).

## The application should include:

- Research proposal, including background, rationale, aims and timeline (300 words).
- Justification of budget (200 words):
  - What the applicants will spend their funds on.
  - Costing of equipment/consumables, salary etc.
- Significance of the project and expected outcomes of funding (200 words).
- References (maximum of 10)
- Brief CV of each applicant (<u>1</u> page limit/applicant)

## Instructions to applicants:

Applications should be written in Times New Roman 12 point, justified formatting, 1.5 line spacing.

- Word limits must be adhered to.
- Vancouver reference style.

**Applications close Friday October 9th 2020 at 5pm AEDT** by emailing the national secretary glenn.wadley@deakin.edu.au. Funds cannot be spent on travel or conference attendance. Successful applicant(s) must provide a half-page report of how funds were spent, and the benefits they provided (to be presented to council at the end-year meeting and published in the AuPS Newsletter).
